SECTION 5: Limits and Appeals               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. I recommend removing the last sentence of 5.1. "The appeal request form can be found on the College's Transfer to Pima webpage."</li> <li>1. The policy already states that a appeal request must be submitted. Listing a specific webpage seems like an unnecessary administrative burden, as webpages change constantly.</li> </ol> </li> </ol>	Agree, we will remove.
2-12-2026	<p>"3.5 Up to 75% of program requirements may be met with transfer credit as long as students also satisfy in-residence credit hours toward program requirements."</p> <p>The previous language stated a maximum of 75% of a degree or certificate could be earned through prior learning or transfer credit. In the current draft, this explicit limit seems to have been deleted. Without this, it is unclear how many credits a student may transfer toward a degree or certificate at PCC. Could you clarify:</p> <p>Is there still a maximum number of transfer credits allowed per program?</p>	<p>The College sets the minimum expected in-residence credits a student must complete at the College. See AP 3.25.02. By setting the minimum of those credits that must be in-residence, we have set the rule. The remainder of the certificate or degree, can be from transfer or PLA. Since certificates come in various sizes, using credit thresholds keeps the minimum and maximum to whole numbers, as percents create mixed number scenarios.</p>
