## Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP)

The Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP) is a partnership between Pima Community College and Arizona State University which allows nursing students the opportunity to complete their Associate of Applied Science (AAS) in nursing through PCC while simultaneously completing their Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) through ASU. CEP students take nursing coursework in-person at PCC and online through ASU. This program offers a time-efficient and cost-effective pathway to the BSN. Upon completion, students will graduate with both their AAS in nursing from the community college and their BSN from ASU.

### Steps to Apply

1. Meet with an academic advisor at PCC Nursing.
2. Attend a PCC Nursing Information Session
3. Once prerequisite coursework is complete, submit the CEP application through MyPima application portal when available.

It is recommended that students complete PCC co-requisites prior to enrolling in the CEP.

### Selection Process

1. PCC will review applications for admission and placement.
2. ASU will determine eligibility for the CEP (see requirements below). *Notification of eligibility does not indicate admission to the CEP. Students must be placed by PCC for a specific semester to participate in the program.*
3. Pima CC notifies students of placement. Students must accept their space according to PCC's requirements.

### ASU Eligibility Requirements

A minimum 3.0 GPA in the following prerequisite courses is required.

BIO 202IN	Human Anatomy/Physiology II	4
BIO 205IN	Microbiology	4

Note: A quantitative science (SQ) course – such as CHM 130IN – is required to graduate from ASU. We recommend completing this course prior to enrolling in the CEP.

1. Statistics. *If needed. Can be taken at ASU or PCC (PSY 230 or MAT 167).*
2. General Studies or Upper Division elective. *If needed.*
3. Additional NUR courses as prescribed by an advisor.

### Additional ASU Graduation Requirements

120 credit hours are required to graduate from ASU, including 45 upper division (300/400-level) credit hours. Depending on academic record, general studies completion may be required.

Example:

120 Credits needed for BSN
<u>-75</u> AAS Nursing/Community College transfer credits
45 Upper division credits required
<u>-36</u> ASU CEP credits
9 Upper division general studies credits required
