Position Title: Manager, Clery Compliance & Emergency

Job Group: Campus Police

Job Level Group: Manager/Supervisor/Lead

FLSA Status: Exempt

Position Summary:

The Clery Compliance Manager is responsible for coordinating the College's Clery Act Compliance Program. The Clery Compliance Officer/Coordinator works in conjunction with the Office of Internal Audit, as well as collaboratively with various other offices at the College to ensure the institution's compliance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act and associated regulations.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

Examples of key duties are interpreted as being descriptive and not restrictive in nature. Incumbents routinely perform approximately 80% of the duties below.

1. Develop and coordinate the College's Clery Act Compliance policy and program
2. Prepare, publish and distribute the Annual Security and Fire Safety Report
3. Ensure reports accurate and available to prospective students and employees
4. Identify and train the College's campus security authorities regarding reporting requirements.
5. Gather crime and disciplinary referral data from various internal and external sources, such as local law enforcement agencies
6. Work with the College police department to ensure proper classification of crime incident reports
7. Work with local police agencies to monitor and record criminal activities at off-campus locations of the College
8. Consolidate relevant data from sources with information and policies from across institutional departments
9. Ensure the College maintains accurate records on security awareness and crime prevention programs and presentations
10. Maintain knowledge of pending and final changes to the Clery Security Authorities at the end of each year
11. Serve as the records custodian for all Clery Act-associated records
12. Coordinate the annual crime statistics to the Department of Education, as required
13. Research and produce reports requiring data collection, graphs and studies
14. Performs all other duties and responsibilities as assigned or directed by the supervisor.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

1. Knowledge of regulatory compliance principles and practices
2. Knowledge and application of organizational and time management principles
3. Skill in coordinating and monitoring the work of others
4. Skill in effective communication (both written and oral)
5. Skill in independent decision making
6. Skill in people leadership and supervision
7. Skill in organization, coordination and management
8. Skill in program development and process improvement
9. Ability to apply effective and accurate data entry and typing skills
10. Ability to develop and maintain effective and positive working relationships

Supervision:

- Supervises work of others, including planning, assigning and scheduling work, reviewing work and ensuring quality standards, training staff and overseeing their productivity, and signing employee(s) performance evaluation. May have responsibility for making decisions on hiring, termination and pay adjustments.

Independence of Action:

- Results are defined and existing practices are used as guidelines to determine specific work methods. Carries out work activities independently; supervisor/manager is available to resolve problems.

Competencies:

Competencies are the actions and behaviors that can be observed as to how work gets done that supports the College's values and strategic objectives.

- **Organizational Culture:** Provides an opportunity to impact the organizational culture of Pima Community College by both acknowledging the College's past and helping to chart its future.
- **Governance, Institutional Policy, and Legislation:** Allows impact on the guidelines that determine how the College operates.
- **Student Success:** Allows the opportunity to support student success as well as improve access and retention.

Minimum Qualifications:

Candidates/incumbents must meet the minimum qualifications as detailed below.

- Bachelor's degree in a related field of study required.
- Master's degree in a related field of study preferred.
- Three (3) to five (5) years of related experience in records management.
- Five plus (5+) years of related experience preferred.
- One (1) to Three (3) years of supervisory experience required.
- OR An equivalent combination of certification, education and experience sufficient to successfully perform the essential duties of the job such as those listed above

Physical Demands:

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the key duties and responsibilities of this job. **Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform critical tasks.**

- **Environment:** Work is performed primarily in a standard office environment with staff contact and frequent interruptions.
- **Physical:** Primary functions require sufficient physical ability and mobility to work in a standard office setting; to stand or sit for prolonged periods of time; to occasionally stoop, bend, kneel, crouch, reach, and twist; to lift, carry, push, and/or pull light to moderate (up to 20 pounds) amounts of weight; to operate office equipment requiring repetitive hand movement and fine coordination including use of a computer keyboard; may be required to travel to other locations using various modes of private and commercial transportation; and to verbally communicate to exchange information.
- **Vision:** Ability to see in the normal visual range with or without correction.
- **Hearing:** Ability to hear in the normal audio range with or without correction.
